Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the Old Testament Reading, the prophet Amos, though previously a herdsman and dresser of sycamore figs, must speak, for the LORD has called him. His word of judgment is only part of the message; in other places, Amos calls people to choose the Lord and live, and also announces a great reversal. In time, Amos is driven violently from the Northern Kingdom where God had sent him to preach.

It is dangerous being a prophet, as John the Baptizer also experiences in the Holy Gospel for today. But we know the end of the story: before creation, we were destined to salvation, as Saint Paul tells us in the Epistle. Whatever we face, our faith tells us to listen to what the Lord has to say before paying attention to any other voice. “He will speak peace to His people” (Psalm 85:8). Thanks be to God for His speaking today in Word and Sacrament!

And she said, "The head of John the Baptist." ²⁵And she came in immediately with haste to the king and asked, saying, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." ²⁶And the king was exceedingly sorry, but because of his oaths and his guests he did not want to break his word to her. ²⁷And immediately the king sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison ²⁸and brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother. ²⁹When his disciples heard of it, they came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.
